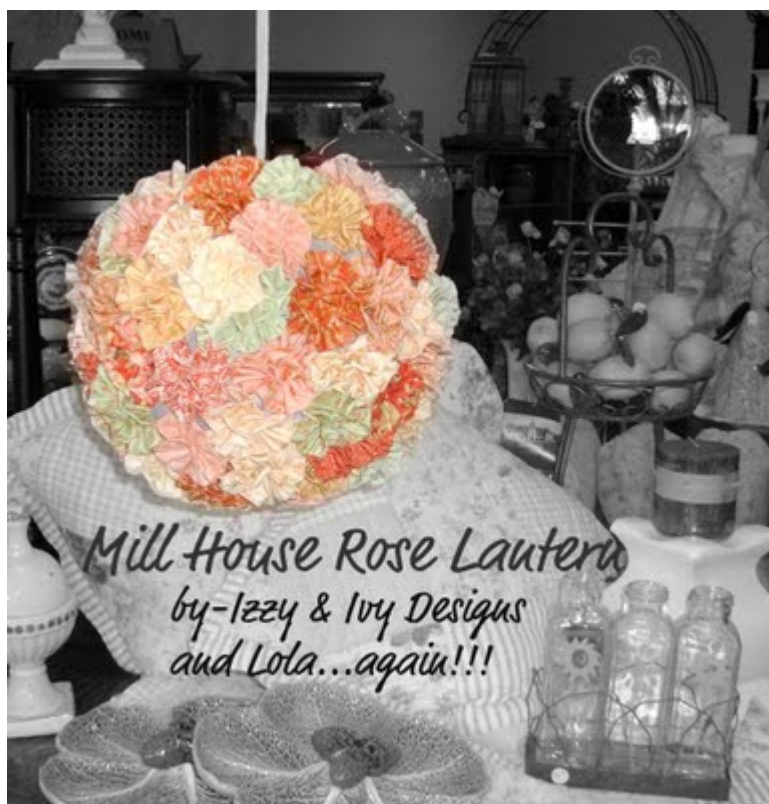

Original Recipe



Mill House Rose Lantern

Hello! It's Lola...again!! I know that it hasn't been very long since my last Bakeshop, but I just had to hurry and get a few ahead. These next few weeks/months are going to be crazy with Quilt Market rapidly approaching.....yikes!! I hope you like it!

Ingredients:

10" Chinese lantern

11 Fat quarters or 1-Jelly Roll

Adjust fabric quantity if you are using a different size lantern.

Instructions:



Step 1- Cut fat quarters into 2.5" x 22" strips. If you are using a jelly roll cut the strips in half so they are 22-ish inches long.

Step 2- Fold each strip in half, and run a gathering stitch along the bottom, securing at one end. You can use a machine, or do it by hand.

I did it by hand so that I could make the rosettes while I was waiting for kids at soccer, dentist, football, etc.



Step 3- Pull gathering threads, and curl strip into a rose.



Step 4- Apply Hot Glue to the back of a rosette and randomly stick it onto the Chinese lantern



Step 5- Keep gluing them on until the lantern is FULL.



Step 6- Hang, and adore!



Yield:

1 lovely Be-rosed Lantern

Wouldn't this be great in a girls room?
