NAME: Walnut Squares

FROM THE KITCHEN OF: Betty Crocker c. 1950

COOK TIME: 25 to 30 min. SERVES: 9 or 16

RECIPE

moda

Ingredients:

- 1 egg
- 1 c. brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 c. sifted flour
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/8 tsp. baking soda
- 1 c. chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 325°F.

Generously grease an 8" x 8" square pan.
Beat the egg until foamy.

Beat in the brown sugar and vanilla.

Sift flour, salt and baking soda. Stir into egg-sugar mixture.

Stir in walnuts.

Spread in prepared pan - the mixture will be quite sticky.

Bake for 25 to 30 minutes - until the top has a dull crust on the top.

Remove from oven and let cool slightly. While still warm, cut into squares - 16 - 2" squares or 9 bigger ones. ü

RECIPE

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Walnut Squares - because they are a little different, and a bit of a surprise. But they're so yummy and good.

Walnut Squares is made with Sweet Cherry Wine by Blackbird Designs - Barb & Alma.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

2 Sweet Cherry Wine Layer Cakes

5/8 yard - binding

4 3/4 yards - Backing

CUTTING:

None. - Just get ready to sew!

Randomly pair print layer cake squares - make 42 pairs of squares.

Stitch 42 Recipe 1 cards.

Cut grid apart. Press. Remove paper. Trim the points!

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RECIPE

Walnut Squares is made with thirteen alternating rows:

- 4" finished HTSS. There are seven rows of seventeen - 17 - HTSS. The HTSS are randomly arranged - the direction and light/dark placement does not have a pattern.
- 8" finished HTBs. There are six of these rows. Each row has seven - 7 - 8" HTBs and six - 4" HTSS sewn to make a 4" x 8" finished strip. As with the other row - the placement is random. ;)

Join the parts to make rows. Join the rows to finish the quilt top.

How easy was that?

Go enjoy the last of the Walnut Squares... then
bake another batch.

And yes, there are 13 - 4" finished HTBs leftover -
I used them in a pillow. ;)
