

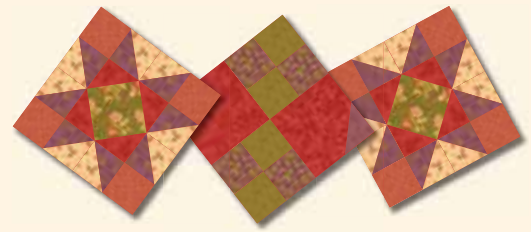

Quilter Basics:

- Read instructions before beginning a project.
- All instructions include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
- Label each group of cut pieces.
- Press seams to one side. Press toward the darker fabric when possible.



Cutting:

From #1 Red tone-on-tone, cut:

- 4 strips, $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece F
- Subcut: 22 squares, $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 5 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece B
- Subcut: 48 squares, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

From #2 Purple/green print, cut:

- 4 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece C
- Subcut: 44 squares, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

From #3 Green pin dot, cut:

- 3 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece H
- Subcut: 24 squares, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 2 strips, $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x wof – Piece J
- Subcut: 20 squares $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ "
- Cut each square once diagonally to yield 40 triangles

From #4 Red print, cut:

- 5 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece E
- Subcut: 48 squares, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

From #5 Purple/green, cut:

- 9 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece I
- Subcut: 96 squares, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

From #6 Natural/red print, cut:

- 5 strips, $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece D
- Subcut: 48 rectangles, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

From #7 Purple pin dot, cut:

- 2 strips, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece G
- Subcut: 22 squares, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

From #8 Green/natural print, cut:

- 2 strips, $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof – Piece A
- Subcut: 12 squares $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

From #9 Red/gold print, cut:

- 9 strips, 2" x wof for Border #1
- Piece and subcut: 4 strips 2" x 18" for corner borders
- 2 strips, 2" x 59" for side borders
- 2 strips, 2" x 42" for top and bottom borders

From #10 Purple floral print, cut:

- 1 strip, 10" x wof for Border #2
- Subcut: 2 squares, 10" x 10" — cut each once diagonally to yield 4 triangles
- 10 strips, $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof for Border #2
- Piece and subcut: 2 strips, $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $71\frac{1}{2}$ " for side borders
- 2 strips, $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $71\frac{1}{2}$ " for top and bottom borders

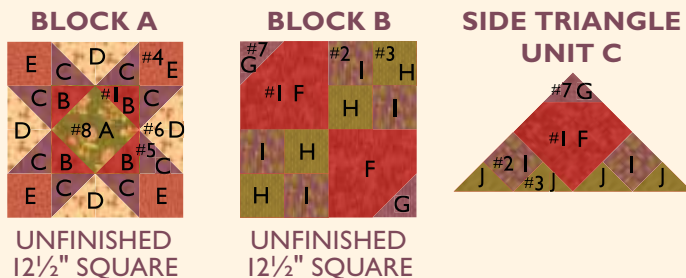
From Binding, cut:

- 9 strip, $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x wof

Finished quilt measures 70" x 87"

Construction:

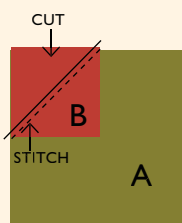
Cornucopia quilt is made up of 3 basic units plus borders.



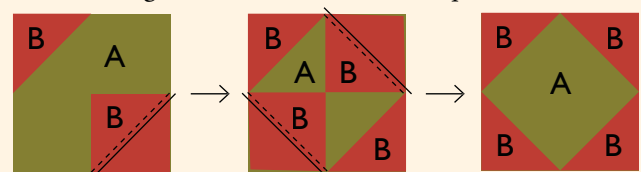
Block A – Make 12

1. Make the center “Square in a Square” with the Quick Corner Triangle method.

- a. Draw a diagonal pencil line, from corner to corner, on the wrong side of all 48, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of fabric #1. Place one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square on one corner of a $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square of fabric #8 with right sides together and edges matching. Note the direction of the drawn line. Stitch a thread's width beside the drawn line on the corner side. Press the smaller square corner back over the seam line to match the outside corner. Trim away the two bottom layers leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam.



- b. Complete the unit by repeating the method on the remaining corners of the fabric #8 square. Unit A/B.

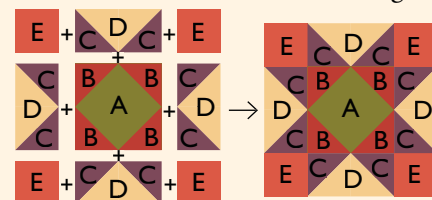


2. Make the side “flying geese” units with the same Quick Corner Triangle method as above. Draw a diagonal pencil line on the wrong side of all 96, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of fabric #5. Join 1, #5 square on each end of 48, $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles of fabric #6. Unit C/D/C.



3. Assemble Blocks A

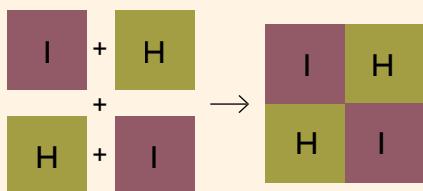
- a. Arrange the A/B units, C/D/C units and the #4 E squares as illustrated. Note the direction of the diagonal lines.



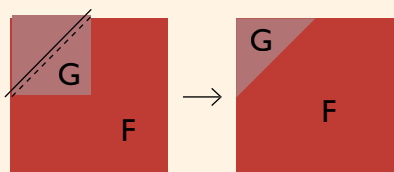
- b. Sew pieces together in horizontal rows. Press seams toward the flying geese unit.
- c. Sew rows together. Press. Make 12. Trim to 12½" square.

Block B – Make 6

1. Make 12 four-patch units with 3½" squares of fabric #2 piece I, and fabric #3, piece H.

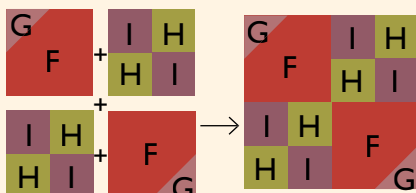


2. Make 12 F/G units with Quick Corner Triangle method. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 12, 3½" squares of fabric #7. Create the corner triangle on 12, 6½" squares of fabric #1.



3. Assemble Blocks B

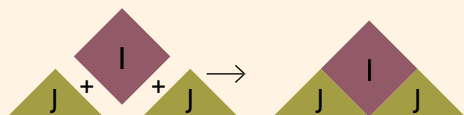
- a. Arrange the F/G and the H/I units as illustrated. Notice the direction of the diagonal line.



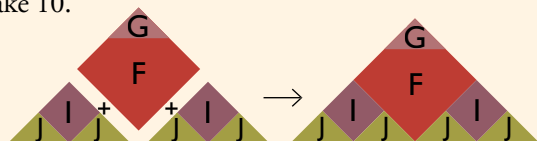
- b. Sew units together in horizontal rows. Press seams toward F/G unit.
- c. Sew rows together. Press. Make 6. Trim to 12½"

Side Triangle Unit C – Make 10

1. Repeat Block B, step 2. Use same fabric. Make 10 F/G units.
2. Sew 1 fabric #3 triangle to two sides of a fabric #2, 3½" square as illustrated. I/J unit. Make 20.



3. Sew an I/J unit to two sides of a F/G unit as illustrated. Make 10.



Assemble Quilt Before Borders

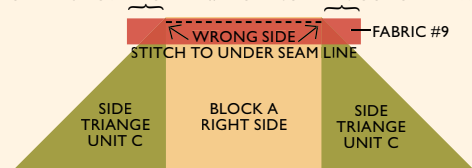
1. Arrange Blocks A and B and Side Triangle Units C as illustrated in diagonal rows.
2. Sew Blocks and Units together. Press joining seams toward Block A.
3. Sew rows together. Press.



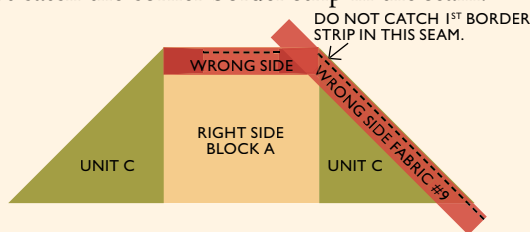
Border #1

1. Sew one 18" border #1 strip, centered on each diagonal corner of the quilt top. Fold the extended portion of each strip back over the sewn portion and pin to hold.

FOLD BACK OVER BORDER #1 TO BE SURE IT IS OUT OF THE WAY



2. Sew one 59" side border strip, centered on both sides of the quilt top. Begin and end the seam line directly on the seam between Block A and the attached side triangle unit. Do not catch the corner border strip in the seam.



3. Repeat for the 42" top and bottom border strips.

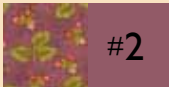

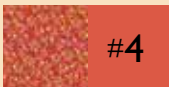

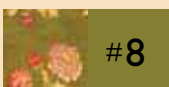

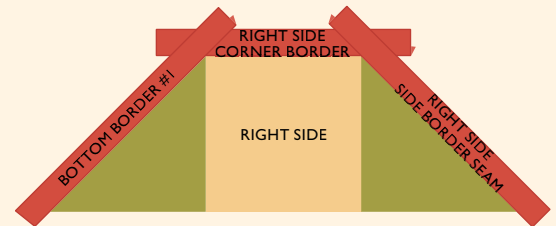
Batting 76" x 93"

4. Open the corner border and press the seam toward the border. Press the 1/4" seam under on the extended portion as well.

5. Second, open the sides, top and bottom border strips and press the seam toward the border. Press the 1/4" seam under on the extended portion as well. Be sure that the side, top and bottom border extensions overlay the corner border strip on all 4 corners of the quilt.

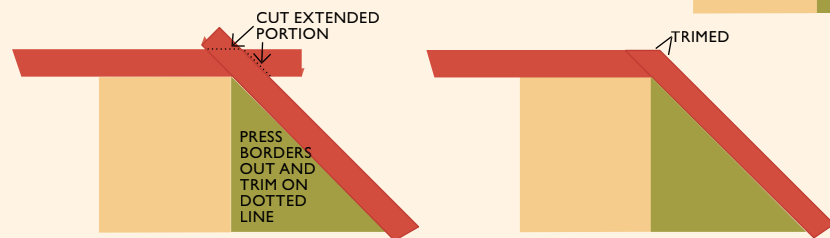
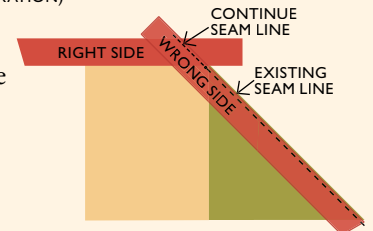
6. Turn the side, top and bottom border back onto the quilt top. Pin the extension carefully across the right side of the corner border and stitch a continuing 1/4" seam line.

7. Press the side, top and bottom borders open and trim as in illustration dotted line.



BE SURE SIDE, TOP AND BOTTOM BORDER EXTENSIONS OVERLAY THE CORNER BORDER STRIP ON ALL 4 CORNERS OF THE QUILT

TURN SIDE, TOP AND BOTTOM BORDER BACK ONTO QUILT TOP PIN EXTENSION CAREFULLY AND STICH A CONTINUING 1/4" SEAM LINE ACROSS CORNER BORDER (NEXT ILLUSTRATION)

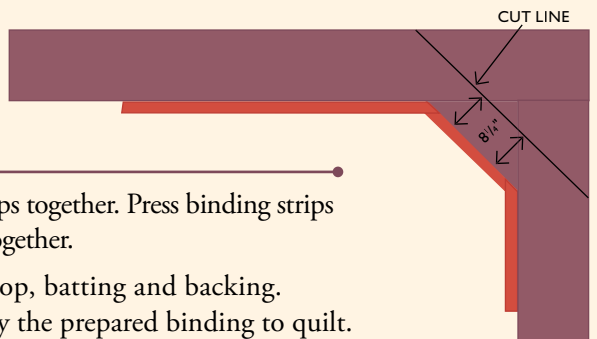
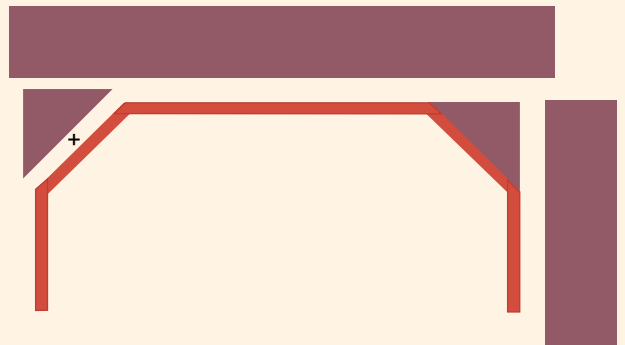


Border #2

1. Sew the long side of the fabric #10 triangles centered on each diagonal corner of the quilt top. Press seam toward the border triangle.

2. Sew straight borders strips to the quilt, sides first then top and bottom.

3. Measure 8 1/4" out from each diagonal corner border seam line. Draw a light line parallel to the corner seam line and cut off the quilt corner on the drawn line.



Finishing

1. Prepare the binding. Sew binding strips together. Press binding strips in half lengthwise with wrong sides together.
2. To quilt, layer and baste the quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt by machine or by hand. Apply the prepared binding to quilt.

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
