Cutting

Fabric 1

Cut 33 – 4 1/2" x WOF strips

Subcut

38 – 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles for border and

200 – 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" background squares

Fabric 2

First Cut 10 – 2 1/2" x WOF strips for binding then

Cut 10 – 4 1/2" x WOF strips

Subcut 80 – 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares for border

Fabrics 3, 4, 5 and 6

From **each** cut 3 – 8 1/2" x WOF strips

Subcut

10 – 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" squares

Cut 3 – 8 1/2" x length of fabric strips

Cut 1 – 8 1/2" x WOF strip

Quilter Basics

*Read instructions before beginning a project.
All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance.
Press as you go. Press seams in one direction.*

Construction

Flying Geese Border

1. Using a mechanical pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 76 Fabric 2 – 4 1/2" squares. Place one square on one corner of cream 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangle, right sides together, matching corners. Note the direction of the drawn line. Stitch on marked line. Press the square corner back to match the outside corner. Trim away the center layer leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with a second 4 1/2" square on the opposite corner of the rectangle. Make 38 pieced border units. Press triangles toward corners. *See diagram below.*

2. Make 2 border strips with 10 units and 2 with 9 units. Stitch together end to end, all facing the same direction.

3. Sew one aqua 4 1/2" square to each end of the 9 unit border strips to make top and bottom borders.

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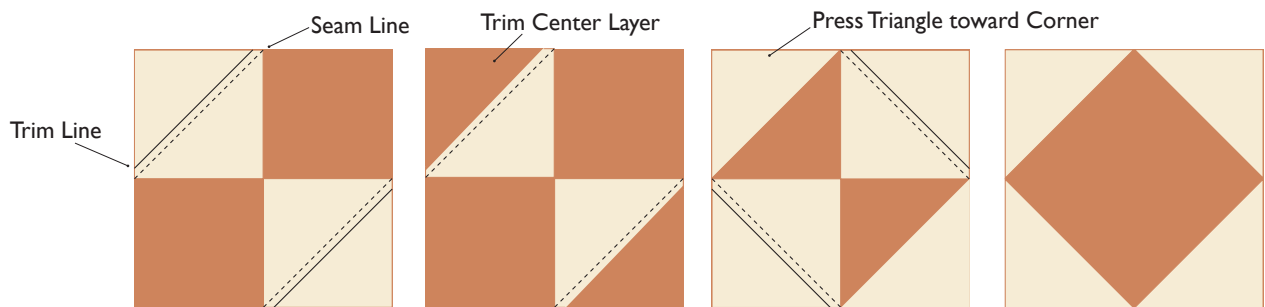
Pieced Border Unit – Make 38



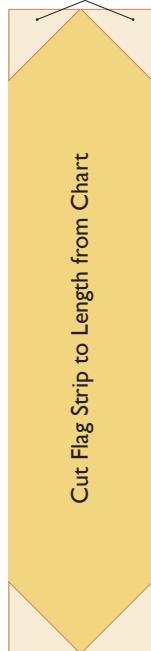
Construction-cont.

Square in a Square Blocks – Make 40 – 10 each from Fabrics 3,4,5,and 6

1. Using a mechanical pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all 200 Fabric 1 – $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Set aside 40 of the marked squares.
2. Select 1 – $8\frac{1}{2}$ "x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 3 square and 4 marked Fabric 1 squares. With right sides together, place one $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square on opposite corners of an $8\frac{1}{2}$ "x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square, matching corners. Note the direction of the drawn line. Stitch on marked line. Trim away the center layer leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with a second set of $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square on the opposite corner of the square. Make 10 square in a square blocks. Press triangles toward corners.
3. Repeat Step 2 using Fabrics 4, 5 and 6.

Flags

The following steps apply to all "flags" Check list on right for length of individual flags.

Step 1

If necessary, use a bias seam to stitch strips together end to end matching motif. Press seams open.

Step 2

Refer to list on right for the length of each flag and then cut pieced flag strip to that measurement.

Step 3

Using 4 – $4\frac{1}{2}$ " marked Fabric 1 squares add triangle corners to opposite ends of flag strip. Refer to flying geese border for directions. Press triangles toward corners of flag strip.

Assemble Columns

Square in a Square Blocks – Make 4 columns

Join 10 blocks with like fabrics to make a column. Press seams in one direction. Make 4 squares columns.

Flags – Make 5 columns

Join pieced flag units end to end. Refer to diagram for placement. Press seams in one direction.

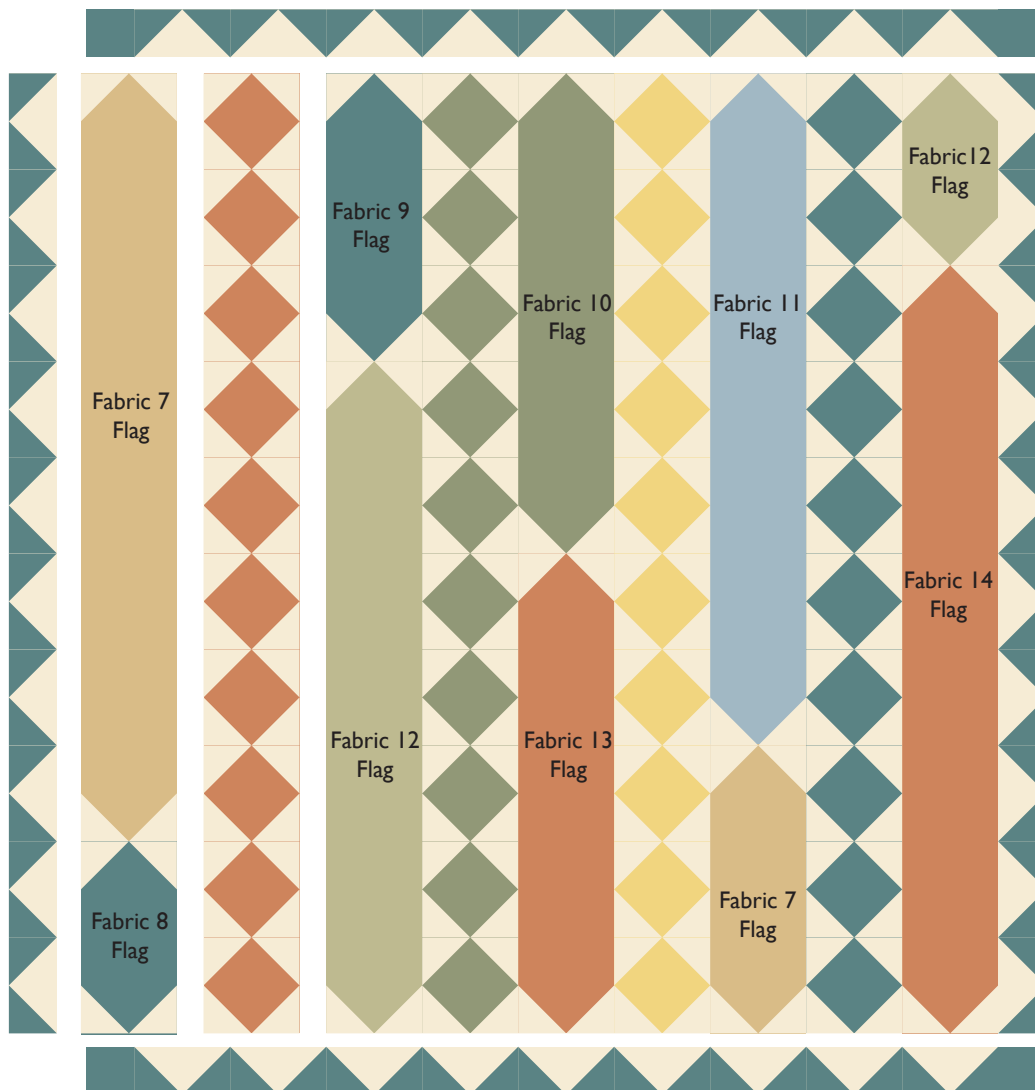
Make 5 flag columns.

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Assemble Quilt

Quilt is assembled in columns not rows.

Join side border columns, flag and squares columns. Begin and end with a side border column – *note direction of triangles, cream triangles should point toward outer edge of quilt.* Alternate flag and square columns. Press. Add top and bottom borders to complete quilt. Press. Quilt top should measure 80½"x88½" with seams.

Finishing

Using a bias seam, join 10 –2½" wide binding strips together end to end. Press seams open. Fold prepared strip in half wrong sides together. Press.

Layer, quilt and bind.

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
